Current Areas

Education Docent

(2 hour shift)

Hawai'i's children and visitors learn about our ocean and its animals with the help and efforts of Sea Life Park docents.

The park's natural habitats become informal outdoor classrooms where docents present marine education using pictures, animal artifacts, and live animal observations. Our education programs are usually taught on weekday mornings so docent must have a flexible schedule.



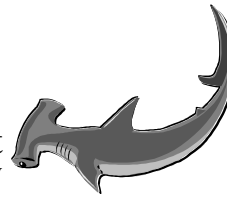
Seabird Rehabilitation Center

(3.5 hrs/shift)

Be a part of the intake, care, feeding, and release of malnourished or injured seabirds. Responsibilities may include cage cleaning, medical treatment assistance, food preparation, and educating our guests on local seabirds.

Reef Life (3.5 hour shifts)

Service Learners may assist and monitor guests as they interact with the invertebrate animals in our Touch Pool. In the morning, Service Learners may be involved in preparing the food for our animals such as the honu, sharks, and rays as well as feed them. Other responsibilities may include rockwork cleaning, sand filtering, cleaning the exhibit windows, and assisting guests in our interactive Stingray Encounter. Be prepared to get wet!



What the professor should know.



Attendance, punctuality, and the quality of the student's work is closely monitored to ensure a proper learning experience. Students agree to a pre-determined schedule. They typically work between 20 and 35 service hours. Upon completion of their project, writing a reflection paper is encouraged. Unfortunately, no interaction with our marine mammals can be provided.

What the student should know.



Service Learning at Sea Life Park can enrich your knowledge on the marine ecosystem. Be prepared to be active as well as study about our animals. The experience you get in your project at Sea Life Park may be a very valuable addition to your resume.

Most students are able to finish their projects in three months. A uniform will be provided. Extra benefits such as discounts on food and gift shop items, as well as reduced admission
